COURTNEY WILBER, Farm to School Coordinator



FREE BREAKFAST & LUNCH FOR ALL ENROLLED STUDENTS!

We are pleased to inform our families that Pellston Public Schools will be participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) as part of the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program for the 2022-23 school year. ALL students enrolled in our district can receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at NO CHARGE to your household each day.

Please fill out and sign the Household Information Survey that has been mailed home; this form is needed for administrative purposes, not to determine eligibility. This survey allows our school to benefit from various state and federal supplemental programs and is critical in determining the amount of money the school receives from a variety of supplemental programs. All survey information is confidential. Without your assistance, the district cannot maximize utilization of available state and federal funds. This survey will also be available in both the elementary and high school offices.














PELLSTON ATHLETICS READY TO SOAR INTO A NEW YEAR!

REGISTER FOR PARENT SQUARE COMMUNICATIONS

All district, school, grade level and classroom information will now be sent via email and/or text. For even more convenience, download the ParentSquare app (available for free for iOS and Android devices). These are the first steps that you need to take in order to sign up for the ParentSquare program:

- 1. Visit www.parentsquare.com/signin
- 2. Under Sign Up/Create Password, enter your Email or Cell Phone Number. You must use the same email or phone number you provided to your school.
- 3. Click Go.
- 4. If the email or phone number matches the information in ParentSquare, you will receive an account activation email or text to register.
- a. If the email or phone number does not match the information in ParentSquare, please contact the office to update your personal information.
- 5. Follow the instructions from the activation email or text.

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
