<u>Athletic Conference</u> – Mr. Seelye led a discussion with the Board of Education about an invitation to join a new athletic conference. Mr. Seelye and Mr. Schlappi shared their thoughts and gathered feedback from board members. 2025-2026 athletic schedules are already set so this potential move wouldn't take effect until the 2026-2027 school year. A final decision is not needed until the fall. No action was requested at this time.

Grid Link Demand Response Program – Mr. Seelye led a discussion with the Board of Education about an opportunity offered by Consumers Energy called Grid Lock Demand Response Program. Demand Response is a program that encourages energy consumers to reduce or shift their electricity usage during peak demand periods to alleviate stress on the electrical grid, ensuring reliability and cost-effectiveness. Grid Lock enables our district to participate seamlessly by automating and optimizing energy reduction during peak demand periods, ensuring maximum revenue generation with minimal operational effort. If Pellston joins, there will be one event quarterly where Consumers Energy may notify us that energy is needed on the grid and we would simply agree not to charge our buses during peak times. An agreement to participate would also include a financial contribution from Consumer's Energy. No action was requested at this time.

<u>Part Time Maintenance Position</u> – Mr. Seelye led a discussion with the Board of Education about the need to hire a part time maintenance person to assist Mr. Chapman. Mike does an amazing job maintaining both buildings, the grounds and the endless list of work orders. Jared will project a budget for this addition and will report back to the board next month. No action was requested at this time.

<u>Bus Driver Hiring Bonus</u> – Mr. Seelye led a discussion with the Board of Education about the ongoing need for bus drivers nationwide. It may be time to consider offering a hiring bonus in an attempt to attract new drivers. This would potentially need to include a retention bonus to keep our current drivers. No action was requested at this time.
